## REFLECTION

This Sunday’s Gospel again refers to vineyards. This time the owner sends his two sons into the vineyard to work. The first son initially refuses to go to work but then changes his mind. The second son says “Certainly” but doesn’t go anywhere near the vineyard. Then Jesus tells his disciples that both will be welcomed into the kingdom of heaven, because even tax collectors are allowed in.
