REFLECTION

Homily Twenty Seventh Sunday Year C

There were two plants named in today’s Gospel which drew my mind back to two past events. Firstly, the mustard seed, as we all know the mustard seed is one of the smallest of all seeds and grows into one of the biggest of all shrubs. But whenever I hear the word mustard my mind is drawn back to first time I tasted Colmans mustard. For years as a child I had seen my Father have mustard with everything and whenever I asked to try some I always got the same answer. “It’ll be too strong for you, you wouldn’t like it”. Of course, I thought that he was just scared in case I liked it and then ate it all. I was also sure that if I liked marmite which had a sharp taste then I would be bound to like mustard. So one afternoon I got the jar of mustard and spread a big dollop all over some bread, and ate the whole lot in one go. When my voice eventually returned the next day and the redness had left my face I came to the conclusion that mustard was not like marmite and that I would never touch the stuff again.

Despite its nice yellow colour and many people’s fondness for it. Mustard has a very sharp and powerful taste to it which leaves one’s mouth a bit numb.

In many ways Faith can be similar, the outside appearance of the Christian religion can seem to be all a bit general and wishy washy. Yet if someone actually receives the gift of Faith from God then it can be a very powerful and sometimes a tough thing to accept and the easy option would be to deny it and pretend that one hadn’t received the gift.

Faith can enhance our lives, it can add more flavour to them and can sustain us when times get tough. Also when we pass the faith on, we must try not to smother people in it try not to be over assertive, rather we should try to gently introduce people to our Church and help them to learn about faith gradually.

Faith is a gift, it is a seed that is in many people and it is up to you to help that seed grow. Furthermore that seed will grow, if the word of God is introduced to their lives. But rather like me and the mustard, a little piece of mustard helps to enhance food, too much and can destroy it. When passing on the faith a gentle approach can help someone’s Faith to grow and like the mustard seed from something small it can grow into something strong, powerful and wonderful.

For us too, Faith can be sometimes a tough thing to live up to, all we have to do is to try our best to love God and trust that he will help us through the tough times as well as the good times.
