REFLECTION

Homily Fourteenth Sunday Year B

We are probably somewhat surprised by today’s Gospel because surely the one group of people who would be loyal supporters of Jesus, would be the people who knew him best.? Those who had grown up with Him, His friends and family. Those who had lived next door to Him, those who had gone to the Temple with Him. However, we hear that these are the very people who were now refusing to listen to Jesus and it meant that He was unable to perform any miracles for them, indeed he only cured a few sick people. He was shocked at their lack of Faith.

Sometimes we too can find that it is those who are closest to us who are our biggest critics. Sometimes their comments could stem from jealousy, other times it can be because they don’t want us to change. But more often than not, it’s because they care about us and they don’t want us to come to any harm. For Jesus it seems as though there is a bit of jealousy and disbelief, because there He was, a carpenter someone who fixed their chairs and probably made the tables that they now eat at. It is hard for us sometimes, to realise that those who are closest to us, like friends and family, are acting out of love and care for us. Sometime, we may think that they have a funny way of showing it, but deep down we do know they care.

I have two sisters who annoy me beyond belief, injure me, attack me, get me in to trouble, have a go at me about the clothes I wear, the music I listen to and the fact they are not allowed to set me up with a girlfriend. Yet deep down I know that they care for me and I care for them. In many ways they help to keep my feet well and truly on the ground.

So today, let us pray for our friends and our families, all those who care for us and those we care for. Let us ask our Lord to be with all of us as we journey together through life.
