**REFLECTION**

Homily 6th Sunday Year B

Today Jesus in many ways performs the ultimate healing. Healing somebody from the awful disease of leprosy is amazing. It was even more amazing in that time, because leprosy was seen as the great disease which made a person unclean and have to live in complete isolation from society. You would have to leave your community and go and live apart from everyone else, you were a complete outcast that nobody would want to have anything to do with you. Even your own family would disown you. Being healed, meant that the leper was not only healed from his awful disease but also that he could go and live with his family and friends again because he would now be considered clean.

There are many people in our society today who live on the margins many who may not feel part of our society and as Christians. It is up to us to reach out to these people, because they were the ones that Jesus always reached out to These are the very people who Jesus worked with the most, for him there was no favouritism, everyone was important, Gentile and Jew alike. The homeless, the hungry, those with illnesses. We must take the lead from Jesus and try to help them belong to our community.

In the second reading from St. Paul we hear St. Paul saying not to do anything offensive to anyone which for us at times can seem to be impossible. The underlying message that we can get from that reading is that as far as possible we should always try our best to get on with one another. When we think of the crisis in Iraq, as Christians, we must always look towards the peaceful solution and not the aggressive solution.

We should always be a people of Peace, not a people of War. A people that are welcoming to others and above all a people that lives as a community before our Father in heaven.
