REFLECTION

Twenty Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time – Year C

One of my favourite pastimes was once to watch the Agatha Christie murder mysteries, every Sunday night, because it used to take my mind off of going to school the following day. I would watch these mysteries and half way through would be convinced that I knew who the murderer was, but about 99% of the time I was wrong. The reason for this was that the person who had committed the crime was always the person you least expected. One night when I was convinced I knew who the murder was, I was absolutely sure that this time I had got it right, but no, in that particular episode, it turned out that everybody had done it.

In today’s Gospel we hear about Jesus cleansing ten lepers, and that out of that ten the only one who gives thanks to God is the one you least expect - the Samaritan, the foreigner. Very often as we travel on our Christian journey sometimes it is the people we least expect who help us and give us encouragement. When this happens it is right for us to give thanks to them and to God, because we never know when we will need their help again.

Today’s Gospel mentions cleansing, renewal and one way in which we can, undergo renewal or a way in which we ask for God’s help in our lives is through the sacrament of Reconciliation. It is during this sacrament that we can have the opportunity to talk things over with someone else. It is when we can talk about our worries or our failings and then receive God’s help. We can receive God’s guiding hand in our lives.

Many people still perceive Reconciliation as the old style confessional where you go into a darkened room and have to confess everything you have done wrong to a priest who is hidden behind a grill. Of course, some find this form of reconciliation helpful and if you do then, that is OK. But for many this is not what they want and indeed the Rite of Reconciliation is far more about the individuals relationship with God and how that can be improved rather than reading a list of sins out. Reconciliation is about an individual being able to talk through the Priest to God and to be able to put into words the worries and anxieties they have and then to receive recognition from God through absolution.

So let us never forget that very often it is those we least expect who will help us and also it is the Sacrament of Reconciliation, the Sacrament which is probably the least attractive of all the sacraments which could help us, and help our relationship with God.
