**REFLECTION**

Reflection for Third Sunday of Lent A

In today’s Gospel, we again hear about Jesus breaking a big taboo, by speaking to a Samaritan. Such an exchange between a Jew and a non-Jew, should not have happened. Not only does Jesus speak to the women at Jacob’s well, he also tells her that she will drink from the water of life-thus reinforcing that he brings Salvation for everyone, not just the Jewish people. Not only is the Samaritan lady not Jewish, but, we also hear that she has been married several times, yet Jesus still talks to her.

Now being a great fan of Dads Army, I am reminded of a particular episode where Sgt. Wilson, who is second in command of the platoon, takes up with a younger woman and is seen walking through the town with her. He also appears to have split up with his long term partner, Mrs Pike. Even worse, it appears that he has hit the bottle. So everything appears to be on a downward spiral. The rest of the platoon are disgusted with what is happening.

The final scene of the episode shows everybody gathered in Church and Sgt. Wilson is the last to arrive. He explains that the younger woman is his daughter. Her mother had moved away with her when she was very young. He had sent money to pay for her upkeep and school fees. Everybody then looked ashamed at the conclusions they had jumped to.

In the time of Jesus, many Jewish people believed that the Samaritans were all thieves, robbers and not worth bothering about. Yet in the Gospel, Jesus shows us that we should not judge others, and that he came to save everyone. So let us always have an open mind and heart when we deal with one another. We pray that our community here will always be a community that welcomes others, because, everyone has the right to hear the Word of God and realise that he came to save everyone.
