REFLECTION

Again this Sunday, rather like last Sunday, we have a gospel which talks about forgiveness. Our Lord tells us that we should forgive one another just as the Father forgives us. For many people, I think that there are two types of forgiveness, one is whole hearted forgiveness, the second is saying sorry for the sake of a quiet life. In the Gospel today Peter asks the question, “How often must I forgive my brother if he wrongs me?” and the answer which is given is seventy times seven. So that is quite a few times.

Peter, however uses the term brother and not sister so that means I never have to forgive my sisters, what a great get out clause that is. The term brother and sister infers that it is someone who is close to us, someone we know very well. There are occasions when it is those that are close to us that we can find it very hard to forgive. And there are occasions when it may take a third party to intervene to help the process. For the majority of the time when we know the person really well and know that they didn’t mean to offend us we can accept an apology, or when we are in the wrong we don’t mind saying sorry.

What the Gospel today really challenges us to do, is not only to forgive one another but to view those from outside our family as brothers and sisters because we are all part of the family of God. To have the tolerance understanding and respect for one another as we do for our family members isn’t always easy. Nevertheless, that is what is being asked of us. Today is Home Mission Sunday, when we are asked to pray for the evangelisation which takes place here in England and Wales. But it is also a day when we look towards the building of communities and friendships between one another. So for us we must first pray for our families and friends and for our community here in Newquay. We pray that we remain a loving, caring, welcoming and forgiving community. We also pray that our community continues to grow and flourish with Jesus as our leader.
