REFLECTION

Thirty Third Sunday in Ordinary Time – Year C

In today’s Gospel we here Our Lord telling his followers about the destruction of the Temple in Jerusalem, an event which was to happen about the year AD70 when the Temple was indeed destroyed by the Romans. For many at that time this event did mark the beginning of the End for creation. This was the first event that would eventually lead to the second coming of Christ. Among many of the followers of Christ there was a belief at that time that the world would indeed come to an end pretty soon. This was not to happen and indeed Our Lord tells us in the Gospel that “the end is not soon”.

In our recent history we too also at times become obsessed that the world as we know it will soon end. Many friends of mine were frantically collecting tins and bottles of water just before the millennium thinking that something major was going to happen on December 31st 1999 at midnight, so whilst I was out celebrating they were at home fearing the worst. Of course nothing major did happen.

In many ways by predicting and waiting for this end of the world we are missing two points. First we forget that God is not subject to time and will not act in a certain way just because it is 31st December 1999. He doesn’t have a calendar hanging up in heaven. God will act when he wants to act and not when we think he will act. There is no way in which we can influence this, or predict when it will happen.

Secondly, we live in a world which is full of beauty, a world which was created by God for us to enjoy, a world which we have been entrusted to look after and care for. So let us enjoy this world because we won’t be here forever. We can waste so much time living in the future and wondering what will happen, or living in the past and wishing that things could be the way they used to be, that we can forget that the present is also important. I’m not saying that we can’t learn from the past and shouldn’t think about the future, but there are times when we need to live for the present. It is when we do this that we can start to enjoy God’s creation, enjoy the company of our friends and our families, and know that we are a part of God’s kingdom here on earth.

We can’t influence God as to when the world should end we can, however, influence the way in which we care for our world, the way in which we care for our friends and our families, the way in which we care for ourselves. If we do this then when Christ comes again we shall be truly ready to greet him.
