**Reflection for Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A**

In today’s Gospel Jesus’s words seem very harsh. He is quite clear in his teaching that we need to try and love our enemies as well as our neighbours. A friend of mine had a great saying when things got tough or realisation hit, he would say, “Wake up and smell the coffee”!

How often in life do we as Christians try and shy away from the right thing to do. How often do we see something happen and then turn a blind eye? When I was at university in London I would often walk past people sitting on the pavement and would buy them a cup of tea or coffee. Then one day I saw someone give a man a sandwich and then sit down and talk with him. I felt guilty that I had not thought of that first. But then after that I would always ask if they wanted some food.

The Gospel may seem harsh but it reminds us that being a follower of Christ isn’t always easy. We can’t turn a blind eye to what Jesus is saying in the Gospel. We have to “Wake up and smell the coffee”. We are asked to turn the other cheek if someone hits us, we are asked to go the extra mile with someone. We have to try and love our enemies and those who persecute us.

The reward for trying to live this life is eternal life with Jesus. We will never be perfect in this life but we must always try. There may be people we can never love, but, it doesn’t mean we stop praying for them. If someone hits us, we may well hit them back, but, it doesn’t mean we don’t try to turn the other cheek the next time. I read somewhere this quote, “A ship in a harbour is safe, but that is not what ships are built for”. If we turn a blind eye we may be safe, but that is not what we were baptised for.
