REFLECTION

Homily Third Sunday Year B

Earlier today we celebrated the feast of “The Conversion of Saint Paul”, which as an event had a pretty drastic effect on the Church as we know it today. If that event had not happened then we would be living not only in a very different Church, but also a very different world. Just as St. Paul had a major effect on the Church, so Christianity has had, and will continue to have, a major effect on the world that we live in.

In the Church we have a belief which is referred to as the Apostolic Tradition, which means that our present Pope can trace the line of Popes from himself back to St. Peter. It also means that the Bishops which were ordained for our Diocese yesterday can trace their line back to the Apostles. It also means that each one of us have a link with those Apostles we hear about in our Gospel today.

We are being chosen as followers of Jesus in the same way when we are confirmed, we too are marked out for a special service in our world which is to live and to preach the Good News.

There are two symbols, two gestures in Confirmation which we have which show us that we are being chosen. The laying on of hands which has been used as a way of sending people on Missions from the very earliest of times, long before Christ. The second gesture is anointing with Chrism, the precious oil of the Church. I can remember a Bishop being ordained, the other Bishops laid hands on him and then the Cardinal anointed him and presented him with the oil of Chrism. At Confirmation the Bishop lays hand on the candidates and anoints them with the Chrism that he had been presented with. The tradition is deep rooted in the Mission, which started with the Apostles being chosen, which we heard about in our Gospel, continues - Our Mission of living and acting as a Christian in our world today.
