**REFLECTION**

Homily Twenty-Fifth Sunday Year A

In today’s Gospel we again hear a parable based around a vineyard and the message we get from it is, that no matter when we turn to the Lord, he is always ready to listen and take us back into his flock.

I guess that there can be nothing worse than to have people push in in front of us when we are queuing up for something. It can get really infuriating when for instance you go for a dental appointment, arrive in plenty of time and the person who is before you arrives ten minutes late, rushes in and then it means that you have to wait longer for your appointment. Or if you wait to park your car and someone pops in before you can manoeuvre in.

So you can imagine what it must have been like for the worker in the vineyard who had worked all day and yet only gets paid the same as the one who worked for a very short period of time. To us, none of these scenarios seem very fair or just, yet this is what the Gospel says and then it finishes with a very familiar saying, that the first will be last and the last will be first. The message that Our Lord is trying to get across, is that before the Lord, we are all equal. He has no favourites. All that he asks is that we live according to his commandments. When we need to ask God for his forgiveness we shall receive the same treatment as everyone else when we eventually go to our eternal reward in heaven.

Jesus has no favourites he came to offer everyone the possibility of salvation.

There are no club classes, business classes and economy classes in heaven, there are no first or second classes in heaven, there is only one class which is salvation, if you like the Paradise class.
