REFLECTION

CHRIST THE KING

What do we mean by the title Christ the King? When I was in Boston last year I was trying to explain to someone why in England we have a Queen and not a President, but it was a concept which was totally alien to the person, so I gave up. At the last Presidential Election the people had difficulty choosing their President, I phoned the same person up and said that I bet they wished now they had a Queen then they wouldn’t of had all that trouble. In today’s Gospel we hear that the soldiers mock Christ whilst he was hanging on the cross and put above him the inscription “This is the king of the Jews”. In some medieval depictions of Jesus, we see him sitting on a throne with a gold crown on his head, a sceptre in one hand and an orb in the other. Is this the kind of King which Jesus is? The crucifix that used to hang in my old school, had Jesus dressed in priestly robes with an ornamented crown on his head, rather than hanging on the cross he seemed to be just lying on it, with a happy face. Both of these images are of Jesus in the light of the resurrection and of his position within heaven. Some may think that this is very odd, indeed many theologians have differed in their views down through the ages whether Christ should be seen as a suffering servant or a triumphant saviour. However, these two images of the crucifixion are necessary for us today if we are to get a true picture of Christ, of who he is and what he does for us.

Both models are important. We must never lose sight of the crucifixion and what a brutal death it entailed. This act in itself showed that Christ died for all. We know this by the mere fact that Christ was crucified outside the city of Jerusalem and in public, emphasising that he came to save Gentile and Jew alike.

The second view of the cross, that of the triumphant Christ, reminds us of the resurrection and that Christ is seated at the right hand of the Father in heaven. Christ rules over the Kingdom that is to come. In the Gospel Christ tells us that his Kingdom is not of this world but of a world to come, and his Kingdom is bigger and more powerful any of the Kingdoms of this world in which live. We hear him tell the criminal who asks to be remembered when Christ arrives in his kingdom, that today you will be with me in paradise.

So for us, Christ is the consoler of those in trouble and distress, he is the champion of the poor and those who seek justice and liberation. He is the King of those who seek peace and understanding. For Christ our King, has a weapon which is much more powerful than the world’s biggest gun, tank and battleship all put together. He governs his people with a law which is more powerful than any man made law. The weapon which he uses and the law with which he governs is that of love.
