REFLECTION

HOMILY CHRIST THE KING YEAR B

Whenever I think of the term King, many pictures come into my mind of what a King should be, what he should look like and how should he act. For instance is Christ a King in the same sense as we have a King or a Queen.? In England of course we are still technically Royal subjects so, are we also Christian Subjects in the same way. Nowhere in the Gospels does Christ refer to us as his subjects, we are his people. He is the shepherd, we are his flock

When we look at depictions of the crucifixion in art and in icons we get two images of Jesus. He is either dressed in priestly robes with a crown on his head looking as if he is merely imitating a cross shape with his arms or he is depicted as a suffering Christ hanging from the cross, showing the pain of the crucifixion and just what an awful form of torture it really was. The first is a triumphant Christ risen from the dead, the second is the suffering servant.

Jesus is a King who sacrificed himself for our salvation and our freedom. He was a leader who knew that he was going to have to suffer at some point for us. He is a King who we can serve by loving one another. He showed us the power of his love for us, in return he asks us to live together as a community serving one another. We have to see Christ in one another.

I can always remember when I was training to be a friar in a religious order, my prior saying to me that the most effective form of leadership, was to lead from within the group. This was allowing the group to flourish, to allow the group to take the credit rather than the leader. He did have a bit of trouble implementing this though, unfortunately. With Christ we see our leader as very much part of our group because we see him in one another.

Jesus then is a King who rules his kingdom with love, compassion and understanding. He doesn’t need to use weapons of mass destruction in order to gain respect, because he has the most powerful weapon of all, which is love.
