**REFLECTION**

Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time – Year C

In today’s Gospel Our Lord emphasises the importance of not only having good thoughts, pious thoughts but that these must be followed by actions. I have met many people who claim that coming to Church isn’t important and that they don’t need to because they lead a good life, pray regularly and are always willing to help anyone. So there’s no point in going to Church and furthermore Sunday is the only day of the week when they get a rest. The problem with this view of the Catholic Faith is that it loses one of its fundamental aims that of being a community. It loses the idea of a community of believers worshipping together. When we come to Church on a Sunday we not only pray together, for each other, but we also come together to celebrate the fact that because Christ became man and suffered for us he won for us salvation. It is at Mass that we receive Christ in the form of bread and wine and by this we know that he dwells within us. It is important that this is done as a community, not as individuals.

In the Gospel we hear about two people, a Pharisee and a tax collector who go to the temple to ask for forgiveness, the Pharisee asks for prayer in private the tax collector asks out loud. It is the tax collector who receives forgiveness. Now this isn’t saying to us that we should stand up in the middle of the church and tell everyone what we have done wrong. What it is saying is that whilst praying in private is good and important, there are times when we need to come together as a community and pray together and worship together.

Working together can sometimes produce amazing results. An example which I always like using is that of a famous race which happened on May 6th 1954. This was a race with a difference, in that everyone in the race was helping each other and in particular helping one man to break the four minute barrier. Believe me, as someone who used to run the mile in races, running one in under four minutes is very nearly impossible. Back in 1954 many believed it was impossible for anyone to do. But a man called Roger Bannister, with the help of Chris Chataway and Chris Brasher, managed to do it. Working together as a team the impossible was made possible.

So to when we work together as followers of Christ that we to can make many things which seem impossible possible
