Homily 4th Sunday year A

In today’s Gospel Jesus presents his disciples and us with the Beatitudes. Whenever I hear the Beatitudes read out, I automatically link them with the Ten Commandments. They are of course linked; the Ten Commandments are handed to Moses from God and are the law from which the Israelite people who are travelling to the promised land are expected to live by. The Beatitudes are a deeper understanding of the rules, rather than using the phrase “You shall not”, they use the phrase “How happy are you”. They emphasise the positive rather than the negative. They link Jesus with Moses, the Old Testament with the New Testament. What the Beatitudes introduce is the idea of compassion, the concept of a compassionate God.

The difference between emphasising the negative or positive reminds me of a young boy who had just received a pair of roller skates for his birthday. After a couple of weeks, he decided to see how fast he could go. So, one Saturday morning he announced to his Mother that he was going to try and reach 60 miles per hour on them. Immediately he was a hit with some familiar catchphrases, “Well if you fall over and break your legs, don’t come running to me”! and “If you fall over, don’t come crying to me, because I will give you something to cry about”! Then he went to his elder brother and announced what he was going to do and he said; “Perhaps you should try and a bit slower, you will be much happier”. So, the day came and he got himself ready, but before he even got five metres he mistook a bend and ended up in a neighbour’s flower bed.

There are many times when we give advice to friends or to members of our families, when it would be easy to say in answer to a problem, “Oh don’t be so silly”, or “pull yourself together and get a grip on reality”. There are occasions, however, when it would be better to emphasise the positive and say, “Wouldn’t it be better if...”, or “have you thought of doing it this way”? This is the way Jesus talks to us in the Gospel, emphasising the positive, showing us his compassion. So when we give advice to our friends or to members of our families, let us always do so with compassion and care.
