REFLECTION

Homily 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C

In today’s Gospel our Lord gives us a stark warning, which is to remind us that we should always remember that we are part of a wide and diverse community of believers. He uses the imagery of the rich man and Lazarus to get his point across. Jesus tells us that whilst the rich man has a good life on earth, because he keeps Lazarus outside his gates, apart from him, when both die Lazarus goes to heaven to be with Our Lord, whilst the rich man goes to a place which is apart from God. If you like he remains outside the gates of heaven.

It can be very easy and not always our fault, to not look beyond our community here in Newquay, maybe not even to look beyond our family or extended family unit. My Father always uses the saying “Charity begins at home”, and while this in itself is good, we must not forget that there are other parts of the world where people are in need. We must also look beyond our Christian religion, to Muslims, Buddhists, Jews and other faiths as we are all God’s creation after all. The creed, the colour and the name don’t matter.

I was very lucky in growing up in a part of London which was very multi-cultural. My parish of Wembley Park at one time had over 100 different nationalities in it. In London we were blessed with such diversity. This means that we have to treat everyone in a Christian way and not put them outside the gates of our community. Our Gates must always be open. It is when this happens that we are truly acting in a way that pleases God. Diversity comes in many forms. Here in Newquay we are no different – with class, taste, opinion, needs and wants etc.

We must never forget that Christ did not come as saviour of a certain section of creation. He came as saviour of all. Gentile and Jew alike.

This Gospel reminds me of a particular incident which happened to me when I was working in a parish abroad. The Parish priest I was with, said that he would like me to go and do some visiting. He gave me two addresses to go and visit. I was told that the first were a nice family and that it would be a gentle introduction to the parish. The second address I was told was completely different, but I would see both sides of the parish. So I knocked on the door of the first address, “the nice family”. The door opened and I said “hello, I’m Deacon Anthony” they said “that’s nice for you” and shut the door. So I went to the second family “the suspect” family. I knocked on the door and there was no answer, I knocked again, still no answer. So I began to make my way back to the parish, thinking that I had had enough of this parish. On my way home I was getting closer to the Church when I had to cross the road and of course I looked the wrong way, thinking I was in England and nearly got knocked over. The driver pulled over and said “sorry Father are you OK”? We got talking and she said she was from the parish, she was most charming and took me home for a cup of iced tea. Yes, you have guessed it, she lived in the very house that I went to visit. “The suspect family”. This taught me two things, firstly, not to judge people on what other people say and secondly, never to drink iced tea again.

So let us always keep an open mind and try to treat everyone with respect. And the gates of heaven will always be open to us.
