REFLECTION

In one of the Parishes I served, there was a big Victorian cabinet standing in the dining room and it was always closed. I always wondered what was inside, but every time I asked the Parish Priest what was inside he just said “never mind, just leave it alone”. Then the day came, when we were decorating the dining room for Christmas and I was looking for the decorations and asked if they might be in the cabinet? The Parish Priest said “oh, just leave it!” anyway I opened it and both the doors fell off and it was empty. He said “I told you!” There will be many times in life when we are given advice and we don’t listen.

In the Gospel today, Jesus, reminds us that we need to be ready for when he returns. The imaginary of Oil Lamps and being served at the table, foretells what will happen later on, at the Last Supper. This reminds the Disciples that Christ is the new Passover, and that Christians are the heirs to the liberation Jesus won by his death, and resurrection and thus share in his act of redemption.

The idea of being served at a table reminds us of the Eucharist, when we remember the institution of the Eucharist, the heavenly food, The Body and Blood of Jesus which gives us the strength, to truly welcome Jesus when he returns.

So we must be ready for when he returns, we don’t know when this will happen, but it will happen. Jesus tells us time and again so we need to listen. We are usually given advice for a reason, so let us always be ready to welcome Jesus when he returns in glory.
