REFLECTION

One of my favourite pass-times, is to watch the Agatha Christie murder mysteries on TV. When I was young they were always on a Sunday night and it use to take my mind off of school the following day. Even now half way through I am always convinced I know who the murderer is but a lot of the time I am wrong, because the person who commits the murder is the person you least expect.

In today’s Gospel we hear about Jesus cleansing ten lepers. The only one who comes back to thank him, is the one you would least expect, the Samaritan, the foreigner. Very often in life it is the people we least expect, who can help us and give us encouragement. When this happens it is right for us to thank them and to thank God, because we never know when we will need their help again.

Today’s Gospel, mentions cleansing and renewal, one way in which we can experience this is through the sacrament of Reconciliation. Through this sacrament we have the opportunity to talk over our worries and problems with someone else, and then ask to receive God’s guiding hand in our lives. Many people still perceive reconciliation as going into a darkened room and having to confess everything you have done wrong to a Priest, for many this style of reconciliation and if that is the case then that is good. For others this is not the style they want and in deed the Rite of reconciliation must always be seen as healing of the relationship between God and ourselves. Reconciliation is about an individual being able to talk through the Priest to God and to be able to put into words the worries and anxieties they have, and then to receive recognition from God through absolution.

So let us never forget that very often it is those we least expect who will help us and also the Sacrament of Reconciliation, probably the least attractive of all the Sacraments is the one that can help us the most.
