REFLECTION

In today’s Gospel Jesus tells us three parables. The three parables are easy for us to visualise and easy for us to understand. Today is the sixteenth anniversary of the 9/11 attacks on the twin towers in new York and I am reminded of something I was told by one of my Teachers, she said that no matter what row you have had, what disagreement you have had, you should never leave the house on bad terms. It is always better to leave on good terms with your friends and family, because none of us know what the future holds.

There is only one thing we can be sure of and that is what the Parable of the Prodigal Son tells us, which is, that the Father in heaven is a compassionate, loving and welcoming Father who never turns anyone away. No matter how bad we think we are, we can be sure that the father in heaven is waiting for us with his arms open wide, waiting to embrace us.

So for us gathered here today, the Parable of the Prodigal Son linked to the other two parables of the lost sheep and the lost Drachma, shows us that Our Lord will never stop searching, never stop working until all his flock, his people are in heaven. So today let us say a prayer for any “Lost sheep” we may know and those who have yet to return to the Father. May we be consoled with the fact that God never abandons anyone.
