REFLECTION

“You cannot be the slave both of God and of money.”

At first glance, the Gospel we hear seems a bit confusing. Are we being told to be dishonest? This is not the case, the amount the steward deducts from the rents, constituted the amount he would have added for his own commission. The steward secures his future by counting on his master’s mercy.

Jesus is reminding us to rely on God’s mercy and power to save, he also reminds us to be clever and as diligent as the steward in securing our future in the reign of God. This is a “how much more” parable. If the steward provides for his own future by his clever manipulation of wealth, “how much more” will disciples do the same by using wealth to build the reign of God.

Another theme in today’s Gospel suggests that anyone who is a poor steward of the world’s resources, can hardly be entrusted with the truths of the Kingdom. Reliance on God was evidenced by the way believers were good stewards of the resources entrusted to them and how they cared for those who were poor. Disciples are to be clever stewards of all that has been entrusted to them.
