**REFLECTION**

In today’s gospel our lord gives us a stark warning, which is to remind us that we should always remember that we are part of a wide and diverse community of believers. He uses the imagery of the rich man and Lazarus to get his point across. He tells us that the rich man has a good life on earth because he keeps Lazarus outside his gates, apart from him. When both die, Lazarus goes to heaven to be with God and the rich man goes to a place which is apart from God. He remains outside the gates.

It can be easy and not always our fault, not to look beyond our community here in Holy Trinity, maybe not even to look beyond our family or extended family unit. We have the term that “charity begins at home.” Whilst in itself this is good we must never forget that there are other parts of the world where people are in need. We must also look beyond our Christian religion, to Muslims, Buddhists and Jews. We are all God’s creation.
