REFLECTION

Whenever I lead a retreat for the young I will always ask the question;” Is it more important to be happy or rich?” The answer I usually get is “Both!” I then explain this is not an option and eventually the majority will plump for happy. In today’s Gospel Jesus recounts the parable of the rich man who wishes to hoard his wealth.

Is Jesus telling us to give everything away and simply trust in God? For some this is the case, but for the majority this is not possible. What we are asked to do is to never put material things before our relationship with one another or with God.

When I started running, I had a ‘lucky’ pair of trainers, whenever I wore them I always ran a fast time, and if I was in a race I always won the race. I took great care of them and only wore them when I needed a special performance. Then when I went to run my first marathon I packed the wrong trainers, I packed the ones I trained in. I was in a terrible state! I thought I was doomed! So before I set off I prayed to God that I would get to the end. During the course of the run I did fall over, I got dehydrated and I didn’t feel my best, but I got to the end! While I was lying on the floor I did thank God for getting me to the finish.

During the course of our lives we get attached to material things, we may even think they are necessary for us to be happy, but we must never forget the Love that God has for us and the fact that we need to pray and keep our conversation with him going. When our journey of life comes to an end we want to be going through the finish line and into heaven, in order to do this we need the help of God. **FR. ANTHONY +**
