REFLECTION –

“The Holy Spirit will remind you of all I have said to you.”

In today's Gospel, Jesus reminds that he is going away, back to the Father, but will send us an advocate which is the Holy Spirit. The Spirit is God present with us now. God never abandons us, He is by our side all the time. When we have to make decisions we can always call on His help for guidance.

Decisions can be hard to make, sometimes it is not easy to choose between one solution or another. In life we will have tough decisions to make where we find it hard to know what is best. It is at these times that we have to put our trust in God. I never like to make a decision unless I have an idea what the outcome will be I often say a little prayer before acting on a decision. I was once asked to choose three swimmers who were going to swim with me in a gala. I knew that two were fast so I picked them, but the final few were all slow so I had to have a long think, so I asked God to help me and then I picked one of them and hoped for the best. We came second which was a good result for us. So I thanked God and asked if next time we could come first! In our first reading we hear about the Council of Jerusalem, when a decision about how one enters the Church has to be made. They too are guided by the Spirit.
