REFELCTION –

“Now as he blessed them, he withdrew and was carried up to heaven.”

In the Gospel today, we hear about Jesus, being taking up to heaven. In life there are many times when we have to say goodbye to someone we love or care about. We may be waving someone off on a journey knowing that they will return or we may be saying goodbye knowing that we may never see them again.

At one of my previous parishes we had a stained glass window which had a depiction of the Ascension. It showed the feet of Jesus hanging out of a cloud with the disciples looking at his feet. One of the parishioners said if that was the way it happened why didn’t someone grab his leg and keep him on earth?

There are many times when we ask the question, Why has God taken someone we love to heaven? Why can’t they stay with us? These are questions which only God can answer.

When Jesus ascends to God we know that one day we will see him again and until that day we have the Holy Spirit which came down at Pentecost. God never leaves us. With the ascension it is a goodbye, but we know that one day we shall see Jesus again.
