REFLECTION – In today's Gospel, like last Sunday's Gospel, we hear an account of Jesus appearing to his disciples after the resurrection. This time the disciples are fishing when they spot Jesus on the shore. Peter as always reacts and dives into the water. Later in this Gospel Jesus asks Peter three times if he loves him and Peter answers "Yes". Jesus asks Peter to look after his sheep and lambs and feed them. He chooses Peter to look after his followers. This may seem strange to us, especially, as on the night before the Passion Peter denies Christ three times. Surely he would have been better asking one of the other disciples. Why pick someone who may well deny him again?

The answer is, we don't know, all we do know is that Jesus doesn't always choose the strong to look after his disciples, his flock. More often than not it is the weak or those that seem to be weak that he chooses.

We are all human and all occasionally make mistakes. No one, is perfect, sometimes a mistake we can make is to view our leaders, our Priests and Bishops as superhuman individuals that should never make any mistakes. When in fact they are human just like you and me. We are all Christ's followers and we are all his disciples, because he has compassion for each one of us, we need to have compassion for one another.

In the first reading, we see that Peter, and the apostles receive opposition from the High Priest and the Sanhedrin. The Holy Spirit they had received gave them the courage to bear witness to Christ. In the same way because we have all received the Holy Spirit in baptism, we too have courage to bear witness to Christ. But, we as Christians would be a stronger witness to our world if we are united as one community following Christ. So today let us pray for unity and compassion within our Catholic Church and between all Christian Churches. FR. ANTHONY +
