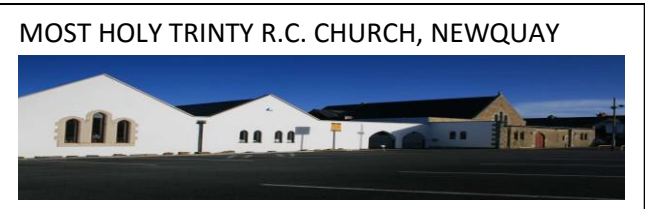

REFLECTION –

“As the father sent me, so am I sending you: receive the Holy Spirit.”

Today, we come to the feast of Pentecost. It seems, as if we have heard about nothing else but the Holy Spirit for the last couple of weeks. Ever since the feast of the Ascension, we have been awaiting the arrival of the Holy Spirit.

In the reading from the Acts of the Apostles, we hear that as soon as the disciples are filled with the Holy Spirit they are able to speak different languages and so the Church as we know it today is born.

The Holy Spirit not only enters our world, but it also enters each one of us, so that we are all responsible for the building up of the Church. The Holy Spirit truly lets us know that God is with us the whole time.

The Spirit does not discriminate, it was sent down for Gentile and Jew alike, everyone has the ability for achieve salvation through Jesus.
