REFELCTION –

"I give eternal life to the sheep that belong to me."

In today's Gospel we are asked to listen to the voice of the Shepherd who is God. We spend much of our lives listening. We listen to good news and bad news, to words that will build us up and words that will hurt us.

Back in London I have a cat called "Mitten" and she knows when I come into a room, she even knows if I am driving up the street. She also knows if I am getting ready to come back to Cornwall. If I phone home my Mother will put the receiver to her ear and will talk to her down the phone. Apparently her ears pick up and she starts purring but then gets confused because she can hear me but can't see me.

We have so many distracting noises in our lives that sometimes it is hard to hear God, yet he does still call. In the Gospel Jesus reminds us that he will never stop listening because he does not want to lose any of his sheep. We might not be able to see God but we can listen for his voice.

So how do we know the voice of God? Being A Priest I believe I have a calling, but I cannot tell you where or when He called me. I heard no voice from heaven. All I know is that events led to me going to Seminary and then to Ordination. It was a feeling deep down that what I was doing was right and this is what I should be doing.
